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

An interview with Kiran Mazumdar Shaw, CMD, Biocon



Biocon is India's Largest and Asia's leading biopharmaceutical Company

Recently Forbes has listed you among 1001 most powerful women in the world. How you feel about Awards and Recognition?

I see awards and recognitions as endorsements of my efforts to make a difference to global healthcare. I take pride in saying that Biocon is contributing to affordable innovation which goes to the core of ensuring a global right to healthcare. Over the years I have been conferred with several national and international awards, including the most recent '2014 Othmer Gold Medal' by U.S.-based Chemical Heritage Foundation and the '2014 Global Economy Prize' for Business by Germany-based Kiel Institute. However among the numerous awards that I have received, the Padma Shri and Padma Bhushan hold pride of place as they were national awards that were conferred to me by the President of India.

What are the key learnings from your entrepreneurial journey?

- Use Determination and Perseverance to **Build Credibility**
- Adapt constantly. Be flexible
- Be prepared to take risks to shape your dreams
- Be ethical and do not be swayed by unrealistic aspirations
- Invest some of what you make back into the community
- Think big and do big

3. What are the 3 major aspects of success for management students?

- Have a sense of purpose and Inculcate an ethos of wanting to make a difference
- Constantly challenge yourself and strive for excellence in whatever you do
- Persevere till you succeed. Failure is temporary but giving up is permanent

4. What should be the key focal areas for management institute like ours?

Management institutes need to incentivize students to think differently - not copy what others are saying and doing. I strongly believe business schools have a key role to play in encouraging students to pursue a path of innovation. Innovation, as I understand it, is both about doing things differently and about doing different things.

Moreover, management institutes need to channel students' innate leadership instinct to create leaders who move beyond mere management and control and focus on inspiring people to succeed. As a nation, India has been creating its share of leaders who are driving economic prosperity. However, such financial growth will continue to yield benefits only for a few unless it involves social growth. With the emergence of leaders who envision inclusive development, India can generate value for millions.

They should also instil ethical values. Students need to be told that though it may seem far more challenging to do things right, it is much more satisfying and profitable over the long term. If you are ethical and straightforward, your business partners will respect you more and competition will learn to fear and respect you too.

5. Where do you see India in 2020?

India, with half its 1.2 billion population under the age of 25, is poised to become the world's youngest country by 2020. Coinciding with that event, India will account for 28% of the world's workforce, according to a EY-FICCI report. Thus, India stands poised to reap the demographic dividend as a greater proportion of young people enter the job market in the coming years, which can in turn lead to unprecedented social and economic development. Without jobs, India's demographic dividend will be a disaster.

An imbalance among the agriculture, manufacturing and services sectors has resulted in insufficient employment

opportunities in India. With agricultural productivity

low and manufacturing sub-optimal, millions have failed to get the employment opportunities needed to participate in India's growth story. We require wellbalanced growth with the three sectors reinforcing each other.

India's biotech sector has the potential to generate growth and employment in each of these sectors whilst addressing the grave challenges we face in terms of food security, affordable healthcare, clean energy, sanitation needs, environmental protection and disease control.

India needs to unleash the power of biotechnology to promote socio-economic progress by transforming agriculture, healthcare, energy and the environment. This will lead to the dawn of a new economic era that can aptly be called a "Bioeconomy". This new era will offer India the opportunity to emerge as a leading bioeconomic power.

In fact, biotechnology can provide solutions to 10 of the key challenges facing India in the next 10 years,

- 1. Energy independence through Biofuels by 2025
- 2. Healthcare for all through vaccines, therapeutics & diagnostics
- 3. Zero public defecation through Biotoilets (both individual households and community toilets)
- 4. Zero landfills through Bioconversion of solid waste to fuel and fertilizer
- 5. Eradication of malnutrition through protein and vitamin supplements derived from GM plants and microbial fermentation
- 6. Two-fold increase in agricultural productivity through Biotechnology to create food surplus by 2025
- 7. De-polluted rivers in India through bioremediation & green technologies
- 8. "Green" polluting industries through Biotechnology: Leather, Textiles, Paper & Pulp, Industrial Chemicals including Pesticides, Coal -based power
- 9. Sewage treatment as a national mission through zero discharge effluent treatment technologies
- 10. Eradication of vector borne diseases like Dengue, Chikangunia and Malaria by 2025
- 6. Your advice to the youth of the country.

7. Your suggestion to empower women in India.



We need to foster a culture that encourages women to educate themselves and realize their aspirations as economic partners. Across the world, educating and empowering women has time and again proven to be the catalyst for rapid socio-economic growth. Conversely, societies where women are repressed are among the most backward on most parameters of development. I believe knowledge makes no distinction of gender and women's empowerment has the potential to unleash transformational societal change and lead to sustainable economic development, thus ensuring that the fruits of economic development are enjoyed by all.

"All the raw materials that go into the syrup are tested and then sent into the syrup maker" said our guide pointing to what appeared to be one of the biggest boiler most of us had ever seen. We

had also seen the bottle making unit where the trademark PET bottles are made from its "preform". Further in our tour we had witnessed a sight where technology and magic harmoniously meet in union, the bottling plant. Watching gallons of the fizzy drink flowing out of tanks, filling in the unending lines of bottles as far as the eye could see was a sight that painted a smile on each of our faces. The devil is in the details so goes a saying, but out there we had seen that the delight is in the details. The quality Check team pays attention to every tiny detail, from the raw materials to the finished product and its shelf life. The priority given to the details is what probably makes Hindustan Coca Cola Beverages Pvt. Ltd. what it is today. The best part of the entire tour to most of us was when we had all been served with our favourite soft drinks! It was all in all, a day of learning and a day of fun, a day we will all cherish.


and not like dreamers who watch others to climb up the ladders of fame and fortune. When actions are changed into habits, there paves ACHIEVEMENT!

Sir, can you tell us about your journey in this department?

Yes, I am into this field for a decade now exactly eleven years of service. And feel very delighted to be in this role. It indeed is a pleasure to safeguard the people of the country.

How did you get into police department?

I always had a dream of serving the society, after my graduation I happened to apply for the written exams put forth by the Police department Board, which I cleared and after the rounds of physical exams I was into the force. It was dream come true for me.



Tell us about your background.

My home town is Mysore. I am a proud father of two little children aged six and four. My wife is a home maker. I think without her support life will not be complete. To maintain work-life balance an understanding life partner is very important.

How do you keep your team motivated?

It is not easy to motivate the team always. However individuals once they are into the police department the challenges keep them very much motivated. The profession brings a sense of commitment and confidence because one involves in the protection of the common man.

May I request you to speak a few lines for our student community?

Sure, discipline is the core component which is to be practiced by the youth. My opinion is that, there is no short cut in life. Whatever one chooses there should be hundred100% hard work and dedication towards it. Nothing comes easy in life.

Do you have any unforgettable incident to share with us?

There are too many. However once we had caught an offender who was stealing two wheelers. It was very funny to note that this individual used to visit hotels and eat a delicious "biriyani" and surrender the stolen moped to the hotelier. I used to wonder about the different behavioural patterns of the criminals.

In the wake of so many woman related issues, do you have any typical message for woman in particular?

I do not want to sermonise anything particularly for women. Because crime was there from time immemorial and it will be there always. Today woman are moving shoulder to shoulder and the exposure is more. Consequently the crimes are being exposed that is my feeling.

Have there been any new laws and amendments?

Good question! There is a recent amendment to law Section 376 of IPC: Anybody from the management or staff sexually abuse the inmate of the institutions will be in the prison for more than six years.

Section 23 Juvenile justices Act: for cruelty to a juvenile or a child will be imprisoned for six months or more

Section 21 of POCSO Act: for not reporting the crime, will be imprisoned for a year with a fine.

Section 201 IP: for destroying evidence will be imprisoned for 6 years

Section 202 IPC: Those found guilty in terms of not giving information about an offence or a crime will be bound under the imprisonment of 6 years with fine.

The above amendments will ensure that the criminals cannot go scot-free.



Panel Discussion on Retail Sector

Connecting students to the ground realities is the need of the hour. In order to bring in connect between the campus & the industry ISBR B School organised a panel discussion for its students. The topic of discussion was the Retail Sector & its growth opportunities. The topic was selected because Retailing in India is one of the pillars of its economy and accounts for 14-15% of its GDP. The Indian retail market is estimated to be US\$ 500 billion and one of the top five retail markets in the world by economic value. India is one of the fastest growing retail markets in the world, with 1.2 billion people.

The members on the panel for discussion included Mr Niranian Kumar Yadav (Head HR-Reliance retail), Mr

Shubham Dixit (Manager-Marketing- Hypercity), & Mr Anthony Wilfred Lawrence (Floor Manager- Max Hypermarkets India Pvt Ltd-Auchan)).

The discussion aimed at helping the students understand the on field realities and equip them to face the challenges that might come across during their course of work. All the panellists helped students understand the challenges faced in their respective departments & what are the requirements of the industry from the aspiring management students.

The discussion was fruitful as it helped the students understand the minute details of the various roles performed in a retail setup along with an understanding of the changes happening in the industry.



Panel Discussion on Manufacturing Sector





Industry connect the most important part of MBA is an ongoing process in ISBR. To achieve this every year panel discussions on various sectors are conducted. The panel discussion on the Manufacturing sector was conducted. The guests were Mr Senthil Kumar, Production Head from Vacon, Mr. Babu Yuvaraj from Bosch and Mr.Saurabh Srivastava from Emerson. Mr Ganguly moderated the discussion.

Opening the Panel discussion Mr Ganguly said India's manufacturing sector could reach US\$ 1 trillion by 2025, as per a study by global management consulting firm McKinsey and Company. This could be achieved on the back of the continually growing demand in the country and the inclination of multinational corporations to establish low-cost plants in India. Up to 90 million domestic jobs could be created by 2025, with the manufacturing sector contributing to about 25-30 per cent of India's gross domestic product (GDP). India was ranked the fourth most competitive manufacturing nation in Deloitte's global index for 38 nations (2013). The country's economy witnessed significant expansion in the period 2006-2011, achieving a five-year compound annual growth rate (CAGR) of 7.8 per cent.

India's manufacturing sector presently contributes about 16 per cent to its GDP.

Mr Srivastava was the first panelist to talk about the challenges of the manufacturing Industry. He mentioned that with the growth of the infrastructure sector and with the growing consumer markets, the manufacturing industry is on the highest gear and is producing for all other industries to consume.

Mr Senthil Kumar said that the manufacturing sector would always operate within control limits Manufacturing sector would continue to grow inspite of what apprehensions people have about dwindling IIPs. Till other industries remain to consume manufacturing sector would produce.

Mr.Babu Yuvaraj from Bosch took the example of the auto industry in terms ogf the growth of the technology space. The panelist demystified the Manufacturing sector and concluded with the huge employment opportunities that this sector offers.

Panel Discussions

Panel Discussion on Finance Sector



The panel discussion on Finance sector was conducted. The guests were Ms. C Vanitha from C Profits Investments, Mr. Nitesh Saha from Edeilweiss Capital, Mr. Raja Ram Kalal from IDBI Bank.

The discussion started off with the opening up of the Banking Sector started in 1978 said Mr. Kalal and went on to talk about the phases of the liberalization process and touched upon the new licenses issued. He talked about the growth of the BFSI sector and pegged it at 25%. He said that since the year 2000 the NBFCs also have witnessed a huge growth. He said BFSI sector forms the backbone of the country. He also pointed out the huge growth in the VC sector. Mr Ganguly moderating the discussion mentioned that though there has been

unprecedented growth there are still areas of growth. Ms Vanitha replying to the querry mentioned that in the last decade the BFSI sector has grown very gracefully, with respect to banks earlier just selling products now quality has come into the system thanks to the regulatory controls, with advisory space becoming different from the Banking space. She also talked in detail about the most promising sectors in terms of growth and investments. She said apart from FMCG, Health Care is emerging as one of the most promising sectors. She said IT looks good because of the Rupee Depreciation and the Global recovery the earning potential of this sector is very high.

She said that for the students who are at the juncture of selecting the specializations and planning to join sectors of their choice need to look at BFSI since the growth potential was extremely high. This according to her is the most dynamic decade. She talked about the penetration of the Banking System and the recent measures that the RBI has announced. Mr Rajam reiterated this point again.

The panelists answered the questions of the audience and clarified the querries with aplomb.

Panel Discussion on Real Estate Sector





The real estate sector is a critical sector of our economy. It has a huge multiplier effect on the economy and therefore, is a big driver of economic growth. It is the second-largest employment-generating sector after agriculture. Growing at a rate of about 20% per annum and this sector has been contributing about 5-6% to India's GDP. Not only does it generate a high level of direct employment, but it also stimulates the demand in over 250 ancillary industries such as cement, steel, paint, brick, building materials, consumer durables and so on.

In spite of such high potential real estate has been unable to attract the best talents in the country to join its main stream workforce. In order to bridge this gap ISBR B School organised a panel discussion on Current Trends in Real Estate which had Mr Ravi Kuradakeri (Partner-Motzkin Group), Mr Anjani Kumar (Marketing Manager- House of Hiranandani), & Mr Tanveer Ahmed Khan (Partner-Motzkin Group) as panellists.

The discussion brought to light the various challenges & opportunities faced by the sector. It also brought to light the opportunities that this sector has for budding management students & how well they can utilize the same to their benefit. The panellists also put forward the expectations that the industry has from the aspiring students.

At the end of the session, the students had a lot to take away in the form of industry knowledge & also a seed of thought of looking at real estate as a career opportunity.

Panel Discussion on Hospitality Sector



The Panel Discussions were introduced with an aim of bridging the academic and industry interface. exercise saw a plethora of industries coming to the campus. Every week a panel discussion from a specific sector like manufacturing, hospitality, retail, real estate and retail sectors. This particular panel discussion was on Hospitality sector. The tourism and hospitality industry is one of the largest segments under the services sector of the Indian economy. Tourism in India is a key growth driver and a significant source of foreign exchange earnings.In India, the sector's direct contribution to gross domestic product (GDP) is expected to grow at 7.8 per cent per annum during the period 2013-2023.


The tourism sector in India is flourishing due to an increase in foreign tourist arrivals (FTA) and a larger number of Indians travelling to domestic destinations. According to statistics available with the World Travel and Tourism Council (WTTC), revenues gained from domestic tourism rose by 5.1 per cent in 2013 and is expected to increase by 8.2 per cent this year. Hotels are also an extremely important component of the tourism industry. The Indian hospitality sector has been growing at a cumulative annual growth rate of 14 per cent every year, adding significant amount of foreign exchange to the economy.

All the above factors and other issues were discussed by the guests Mr. Prem Kumar GT from Spring Leaf retail Pvt Ltd, Raghavendra R from Synergy Pro Events, Siddhartha Modur from JSM Corporation Amit Sidana Accor Group of Hotels, G raghunathan from the Ambient Turett and Mr. Varun Bagga from Oberoi. All of them spoke on the various opportunities that the Industry and can offer. They also gave an insight of the industry and the challenges that are faced by them. The panel discussion paved way for many to students to take this sector as their career.
