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


Business UPDATES -By Prashant Guha



- Ashok Leyland, the flagship of the Hinduja Group has entered into a 50-50 joint venture with the US-based John Deere, the world's largest manufacturer of construction and engineering equipment maker.
- ⇒ Share prices tumbled even as the US senate approved the \$700-billion package to rescue the world economy from slowdown. Foreign institutional investors (FIIs) pulled out funds from India, knocking 529 points from the Sensex.
- ⇒ The credit crunch has not even spared the richest man in the UK steel baron Lakshmi N Mittal. Mittal's fortune has plummeted by \$16 billion (£9 billion) in just 120 days due to recession-hit stock market.
- Nomura Holdings Inc., Japan's largest investment bank, lost roughly 60 percent of the Japanese equity employees acquired when it purchased the Asia-Pacific business of bankrupt Lehman Brothers Holdings Inc.
- ⇒ The Empowered Committee of State Finance Ministers on Value Added Tax (VAT) sought an increase in the States' share in Central taxes to 50 per cent.
- ⇒ Global soft-drinks major PepsiCo India today said it will invest USD 500 million in India over the next three years to triple its business in the country.
- ⇒ In a major ray of hope for foreign armaments manufacturers, Defense Minister AK Antony has said the government would consider allowing 49 per cent foreign direct investment (FDI) in the defense sector on a "selective basis.
- ⇒ Deutsche Bank will buy 5 per cent stakes in BPL. BPL is owned and managed by TPG Nambiar family and headquartered in Bangalore. The board of the company has already approved issue of 24.5 lakh equity shares.
- ⇒ Jet Airways (India), the country's largest private airline, will dilute 10% equity to international funds, Chairman Naresh Goyal said without divulging the identity of the funds, timing and price.



nthony Robbins once said, don't try to be perfect: just be an excellent example of being human and we found such a human being at 17, E-Main, Koramangala. Padma Bhushan recipient, founder director of the Indian Institute Of Management, Bangalore, and known world over as a CARTMAN Prof. N. S. Ramaswamy is, one such man. He is an epitome of humbleness and selfless service and a pioneer in many fields. Rather than falling prey to lucrative management jobs after his retirement from IIM-B, he used all his experience and expertise, working untiringly for the downtrodden and animals.

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"I am not Shilpa Shetty... but still you have come to interview me?" A quick wit flowing from a gentleman at the ripe age of 83. When even the basic faculties of a man are believed to fail, Prof. N. S. Ramaswamy was oozing with new ideas and vital energy which any youngster will be proud of. He is a leader gifted with amazing intellectual brilliance and a learned speaker who has given many a discourse at national and international gatherings. He like Will Durant believes that if India goes, the whole world goes. He says that the world is divided into have and have nots. But India has a third category like that of Buddha and Mahavira, who have but they don't want i.e. who believe in sacrifice and selfless service and Professor follows this category. Seated in his humble office at Koramangala, with Padma Bhushan honour meekly hanging from one of its walls, Professor shared his experiences and knowledge which could humble any erudite.

Born in 1926 in a police officer's home—who later on became IG police Kerala—he did his schooling and college in Kerala. After



obtaining his B. Sc degree, he went to Madras to study engineering in BT Engineering college. Joined an oil company as Sales engineer and subsequently became a management 'consultant in Bombay. He studied management and productivity for one year in UK, US and Europe. In the year 1962, he joined the University of Bombay as a full time professor in Industrial Management. In 1973, he was formally appointed the director of IIM Bangalore. In March of 1986, he retired and started Cartman and Indian Heritage Academy.

He has many firsts to his name... first president of computer site of India, first president of institute of industrial engineering, first president of computer operation society of India. He has acted as an advisor to many national and international institutes like ministry of non-conventional resources of India, Reserve bank of India, Parliamentary committee on railways, Government committee on police training, international bodies like UN for Brain Drain, to UFAO and World Bank on animal thought. Has been declared a pioneer in animal welfare in Cairo, in donkey welfare in Mexico, in buffalo welfare in Yugoslavia. He has been concerned with animal welfare right from his school days. As a chairman of animal board of India, he was not just concerned with

pet dogs and cats, but was the first man in the country to assess the contribution of livestock and how to reduce their pain while working and also while pulling carts. He became famous world over for his work on improving the Bullock cart and agricultural implement. By doing so the productivity of the bullock carts went up, carrying capacity increased three times, there was no damage to the roads, to animals, no animal suffering while farmers and carters increased their income 3 to 5 times. Thereby he became famous as CARTMAN all over the world.

He also started a society by the same name CARTMAN (Centre for Action, Research and Technology for Man, Animal and Nature) that works for animal welfare, rural development, empowerment of women, improvement of bullock cart and slaughter houses, rural transportation, prevention of cruelty to animal, protection of environment from pollution, conservation of ecology, promoting vegetarianism. IHA deals with yoga, meditation, music, dance, culture, philosophy, spirituality, Vedanta, all Indian festivals and it conducts 32 cultural programmes every year.

Government of India had appointed him as the National Research Professor in Management, a very prestigious position held by only ten scholars at any point of time. He is also an active participant in the inter-religious harmony movement. At spiritual level, he teaches morals, ethics and values to many educational institutes in India to help them manage better. He very fervently believes that management studies should move beyond B-schools and business houses. As only 5% of economy and only 2% of work force is absorbed by corporate and around 300 million are employed by Government, the latter can provide better services with management inputs. Professor is of the view that management is the key for man to progress physically, ethically, culturally, naturally and spiritually. His message to the youth of today is very short and sweet...

Making People Profitable

Teaching is not always required to learn new things. Sometimes we need someone to tell us what we already know. Therefore, ISBR invited Thomas International Assessment to conduct Psychometric test of the students to make them aware of their strengths and limitations, so that, they can consolidate or compensate for them accordingly.

Psychometric testing is for personality and behavioural assessments. It looks at,

- 1. ABILITIES like person's capacity to work with numbers, words, diagrams and systems,
- 2. PERSONALTY like how a person is likely to act. This covers a huge range of aspects from person's motivations and values to how he reacts to authority and his/her honesty or integrity.

Under psychometric testing, students DISC Analysis were done. This helped students know the presence and measure of personality traits like Dominance-Influence- Steadiness- Compliance. This test was not about showing one's good and bad qualities. There were no right or wrong answers. It was simply to provide an understanding of how each one of them prefers to behave at work, under pressure and what kind of self-image he or she has.

If you do not know what you have, how will you know how to make the most of it? Therefore, this assessment helped the students take the stock of the talent working for them. In addition, the traits they really need to work upon to make up for them during two years of MBA programme. Training programmes appropriate for the skills each student needs to learn for thriving and successful career were duly mentioned in the private reports handed over to each student.

Companies hire people on their technical skills but lose them on their behavioural skills. Thus, this assessment holds a lot of importance for a student's career and will help the college counsel them wherever they need it.

General Electric, one of the most successful companies implementing Six Sigma has estimated benefits on the order of \$10 billion during the first five years of implementation.

It is said, "A competitive world offers two possibilities. You can lose or if you want to win, you can change". Today's hyper-competitive business environment is creating a need for even more new products, new services, and new processes. Six Sigma is the technique which helps in maintaining that competitive edge by offering a generalized and effective approach for designing new products and services from the ground up. This quality improvement tool can be used by an organization to improve processes like Manufacturing, Accounting, Human Resources, Purchasing and Sales. It is a data-driven, financially focused and result oriented methodology.

DMAIC and DMADV are the two methodologies of Six Sigma. DMAIC is an improvement system for existing processes falling below specification and looking for incremental improvement. DMADV is an improvement system used to develop new processes or products at Six Sigma quality levels.

These kind of training definitely give management students of ISBR a competitive edge over their counterparts in the job market, in the present scenario of cut-throat competition.

Home away from Home


